School Health Service - 'Health Promoting School Nurse (SHS-HPSN) review' - Survey

The Department of Health is currently reviewing the school nurse program.

The online survey is "designed to identify how and what health education is currently provided to students in public middle, senior and specialist schools, and how it can be provided more effectively to improve the health and wellbeing of children and adolescents."

NTCOGSO Executive strongly encourages schools and School Councils & Boards to circulate this survey to families for student feedback on the School Nurses Program to ensure schools continue to receive this service.

Past students (adults) who have attended schools with the School Nurse Program also have an opportunity to complete the 'Past Student Survey'.

11. General Business:

11.1 The issue of increasing disruption in Australian school classrooms (For noting)

On 28 November 2022, the Senate referred "The issue of increasing disruption in Australian school classrooms" to the Education and Employment Reference Committee for inquiry and report by the first sitting day in July 2023.

Submissions requested by 31 March 2023.

<u>The issue of increasing disruption in Australian school classrooms – Parliament of Australia (aph.gov.au)</u>

- Discussions held around the usage of mobile phones in schools would have had an impact on this topic.
- Smiling Minds is an in-school program for children who cannot regulate their emotions and would disrupt the classroom. Suggestions to those present of the possibility of starting this program in their school.
- Access to out of school safe spaces for those children was also a topic of conversation. Where could parents find this information?

11.2 Casuarina Square Ban on Students

On the 7th March Casuarina Square Management implemented a month-long ban on Casuarina Senior College and Sanderson Middle School students in response to the actions of a few. Neither school representative body supports the decision for a blanket ban. Discussions have commenced between the respective Principal's, Chair's, representatives from the department and Centre Management. Both schools are seeking a collaborative approach in future and the avoidance of punishing every student.

NTCOGSO President spoke with ABC Radio Darwin to confirm our support for the school rep bodies position for no further blanket student bans, in addition to calling on governments to provide free recreational activities for youth after school (audio file available on request).

- Discussions held around how centre management would be implementing this ban and how they would monitor the difference in children being at the centre that are with those affiliated schools in comparison to tourists, children from other schools with their friends and family, etc.
